# PLACES TO VISIT

## 1 Canterbury Cathedral

Walk to the monastic herb garden, to have a view the South Oculus stained glass window and the Water Tower.\*

## 2 'Crooked House'

Also known as Sir John Boy's House, built in the 17th Century and mentioned in Dicken's novels, is a photogenic gem from all angles.

## 3 Abbot's Mill

This is a green space and walk from the Miller's Arms PH over the sluices and along the Great Stour up to the Marlowe Theatre.

## 4 Friar's Bridge

You will see the witch's ducking stool, the Marlowe Theatre, the mask and the memorial statue of comedian and pantomime star, Dave Lee.

## 5 Westgate Gardens

Take your selfie with the best view of the towers and gardens from the alcove opposite Tower House.

## 6 The Canterbury Bull

Located in Tannery Field, the Bull was designed to represent the Tannery railway that took workers to the old Tanning factory.

## 7 Canterbury Castle

Get a great view of the exterior of the castle from Castle Street

## 8 Dane John Mound

Walk up the mound to get one of the best views of Canterbury.

## 9 St George's Tower

This clock tower is all that remains of the medieval church of St George the Martyr, where playwright Christopher Marlowe was baptised.

## 10 Canterbury Roman Museum

Explore the wonders and historical finds used to adorn the city over 2,000 ago. Why not take a selfie dressed up as a Roman?\*
